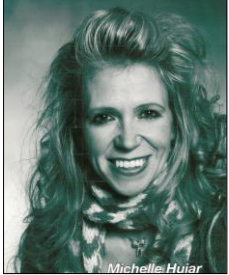
Natalie Green - Drama Specialist

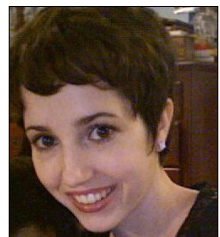
