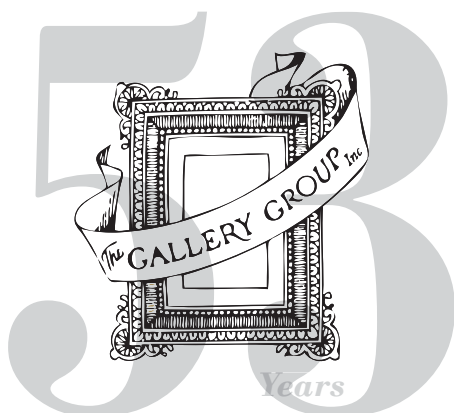

History of The Gallery Group, Inc.

The Gallery Group, Inc., formerly known in 1959 as the "Women's Committee of Lakewood Civic Art", was founded by a group of ten women. Their primary purpose was to promote interest in the Lakewood High School Art Gallery. A second important purpose was to have a Spring and Fall Lecture Series as membership grew rapidly under exceptionally able leadership. *The Gallery Group, Inc.* programs have enriched minds, shared beauty and provided artistic opportunities to countless numbers in the western suburbs of Cleveland.

The Gallery Group, Inc. has given art scholarships at the elementary, high school and college levels. Income generated over the years has amounted to over \$158,650 making these scholarships possible. *The Gallery Group, Inc.* has provided approximately \$84,550 in endowment funds for the Cleveland Museum of Art; \$66,000 to the Cleveland Institute of Art Scholarship Endowment; \$48,500 to the Beck Center Scholarship Endowment. Other beneficiaries over the years include: Kent State University, Baldwin-Wallace College, Lakewood High School, The Cleveland Sculpture Center, The Cleveland Artists Foundation, Artists Archives of Western Reserve, Ursuline College, Friends of the Cleveland School of the Arts, Lorain Community College, Cleveland Playhouse Square Foundation, Intermuseum Conservation Association, Gordon Square Art District and Cleveland Public Art.

The purpose of *The Gallery Group, Inc.*, as set forth in its constitution is fourfold:

1. To promote cultural activity, particularly in the field of the visual Arts of the West Side of Greater Cleveland.
2. To aid and promote the Beck Center for the Arts, Cleveland Museum of Art, the Cleveland Institute of Art and, occasionally, other deserving art organizations.
3. To establish grants and/or scholarships for talented art students from the West Side of Greater Cleveland.
4. To promote a Fall and Spring Lecture Series for the enrichment of the membership.

2011-2012 The Gallery Group, Inc. Scholarships to Beck Center for the Cultural Arts

Fourteen students received tuition for study in 17 classes from Fall, 2011 to Summer, 2012 in the following areas: Beginner Pottery, Intermediate Pottery, Drawing Fundamentals, Introduction to the Arts, Drawing, and Summer Visual Arts Camp.

The Warmth and Charm of Wooster Square and Dalton, Ohio

Date: Tuesday, October 16, 2012
 Time: 8:15 AM to 5:30 PM
Location: Bus will leave promptly at 8:15 AM from *NEW PARKING LOCATION* at St. Mary Magdalene Byzantine Catholic Church, 5390 West 220th Street (Church lot is south of Lorain, between McBeth and Mastick Roads, on the west side of the street. There is a blue and white sign to identify the lot. Park in the back of the church.)

The quaint Wooster Square tour starts with a well-known manufacturer, Rubbermaid. It is located in a historic building built in 1887 as the Quinby Building; it was a department store originally known as the William Annat, more recently as Freedlander's. The fourth floor is a veritable bargainland. Our next stop will be “Artfind Tile Company” which offers a vast and visually rich selection of tiles from 55 different American studios in addition to the owners' own high-gloss, raised-design tiles. Industrial designer, Brigid O'Connor is the owner. Our next stop is to “The Gallery in the Vault,” a studio that displays the work of 500 artisans from all over the world and provides an eclectic mix of mediums for the serious collector and casual buyer. We will be introduced to Kendric Tonn, an artist of printing and draftsmanship. Judy Schmitt is the director. Lunch will be served at “Broken Rocks Cafe' & Bakery” where they make their own breads. The final stop is in Dalton, Ohio. This is where Harry Wilkins/Schmoozer Emeritus will give us the history of the P. Graham Dunn Factory and Store. The grand lobby features carved crown moldings, eight foot tall plaques, and one of Ohio's largest indoor murals. Ascending from the grand staircase, we can watch as the entire production process. It is one of Amish country's premier woodworking sites. (There is a P. Graham Dunn store in Crocker Park, Westlake, Ohio.)

Papermaking and the Art of the Book

Opening in 2008, the Morgan Conservatory, under the direction of Tom Balbo with the support of Charles E. Morgan, created a center dedicated to the preservation of the traditional art of hand papermaking, print and book arts. It custom produces paper for libraries, museums and artists as well as archival and conservation projects. Tour leader, Lauren Sammon, a 2008 BFA graduate of the Cleveland Institute of Art, will explain and demonstrate the hand papermaking process from plant cuttings to paper and how cellulose fibers from the Kozo plant (from the mulberry family and grown at the Morgan) are scraped, cleaned and hand beaten to create fine Eastern-style paper.
Directions: 1-90 East to Chester Avenue Exit; right on Chester; left on 40th St.; right on Commerce and left on 47th St. (one-way). Morgan is on left hand-side at green vertical sign.
